Introduction

Philadelphia Youth Basketball, Inc. (PYB), a nonprofit enterprise, is seeking to hire Coach-Mentors for our Middle School Partnership Program (MSPP).

PYB's mission is to create opportunities for young people in the Philadelphia region, especially those from under-resourced communities, to reach their potential as students, athletes, and positive leaders. Our program models are designed to empower young people to build positive relationships with learning and school, peers and adults, and their communities and future trajectories, using a research-based social and emotional learning (SEL) framework.

Founded in 2015, PYB has been hard at work building a transformative program, organization, and soon-to-be youth center with hundreds of leaders from communities across our city and region. Among our ranks are recognized leaders in education, youth development, basketball, business and law, entertainment, health care, philanthropy, and government as well as active organizers and volunteers grounded in their work in schools and communities.

Middle School Partnership Program Overview

The Middle School Partnership Program (MSPP) is an after-school and weekend program that will run from Tuesday, October 12th through Saturday, March 26th.

As we plan to re-engage young people after an 18 month halt, PYB will administer a multi-faceted, comprehensive, and innovative program. MSPP will provide students from 16 middle schools in the Philadelphia area with an enriching educational opportunity to help them grow to their potential as student-athletes and active, responsible citizens.

The MSPP will engage a cohort of 20 student-athletes from grades 5 through 8 in each of the 16 participating middle schools on two weekdays and Saturdays. The program structure is as follows:

- Monday/Wednesday OR Tuesday/Thursday (approx. 3 p.m. – 5 p.m. pending dismissal)
- Weekday Location: the students' respective middle school campus
- 50% of the time will consist of basketball development
 - Skill-building
 - Team-concepts
 - Game play
- 50% of the time will incorporate youth-centered academic enrichment
 - Literacy and reading

- Engaging discussions, writing, and debating using PYB's homegrown sport and society modules which primarily use essays from the Players' Tribune as context.
- Direction and supports to successfully navigate the high school selection process
- Saturdays (9 a.m. – 1 p.m.)
 - Location: designated high school campuses
 - Basketball game play
 - Healthy lunch with nutrition education
 - Leadership Workshops

Through the utilization of the game of basketball as context, as well as the benefits of positive coaching and mentoring, our students will learn in an interactive environment that will not feel like school but rather a relatable and open atmosphere.

Core Work Scope & Responsibilities

We are looking for highly-motivated individuals to serve as a Coach-Mentor at an assigned MSPP site. Coach-mentors interested in securing additional hours and serving 4 days per week could be assigned two sites.

The Coach-Mentor must possess a passion for positive youth development and urban young people. Program staff coaches and mentors will report to the Director of Neighborhood-Based Programs and the Head Coach at each MSPP school.

He/she will be responsible for:

- Delivering off-court curriculum focusing on i.) critical thinking; ii.) reading and writing; and iii.) civic dialogue;
- Ensuring the in-the-classroom daily activities run intentionally and smoothly;
- Facilitating on-court basketball youth development plan and coaching;
- Troubleshooting with other staff members, including the school liaisons;
- Arriving at the designated school site on Tuesdays and Thursdays at approximately 2:50 p.m. to set-up for programming and leaving at 5:10 p.m. to aid with clean-up;
- Setting an overall positive tone for the week in keeping with PYB's values and approach.

Our coach-mentors must be capable of delivering basketball training/coaching and academic curriculum. We are seeking smart, caring, and engaged adults with a growth mindset, an aptitude for our on- and off-court work, and deep passion for the upward mobility of low socioeconomic young people.

Position Requirements

- Minimum of a high school diploma or equivalent
- Experience working with youth in schools, afterschool/summer camp programs or community settings
- Enthusiasm and dedication to improving the lives of youth and families
- Conflict resolution and problem-solving skills
- Positive communication skills
- Able to work independently and as part of a team
- Commitment to on-going growth and professional development

Clearances

All staff members must possess or obtain the following state and federal clearances prior to training and before engaging in any hands-on activities with young people participating in Philadelphia Youth Basketball programs.

- Pennsylvania State Police Criminal Background Check (SP4 164)
- Pennsylvania Child Abuse History Clearance Form (CY-113)
- Federal (FBI) Fingerprint Background Check (Criminal History Report), if applicable.
- Mandated Reporters - Certificate
